

How can educators get students a library card?

- Library card applications can be printed online or obtained at any library
- E-library card for all ages! <u>http://vf.buffalolib.org/vufind/OnlineSignup/Home/</u>

Adult applicants, 17 and up, will receive a full privilege card.

Youth applicants, 16 and younger, are able to apply for one of two card types:

- If a parent/guardian fills in the consent area of the form, the applicant will receive a full privilege youth card. Parents will have an opportunity to change the profile to restrict video or Internet permissions upon receipt of the physical card.
- If the parent/guardian section is not completed, the applicant will receive a Student Digital Card. A Student Digital Card is enabled for online services only, including OverDrive, Freegal, and homework help via the research databases, etc. These cards cannot be used to check out library materials, nor do they allow the cardholder to access the Internet on a library computer. The card can be upgraded by visiting any library location with the parent/guardian.
- All successful applicants receive their library card numbers via email. The physical cards are mailed to each cardholder's home address.






Book Club in a Bag

For multiple copies not listed – ask a librarian.




Book Club in a Bag

Each Graphic Novel Classroom Kit contains 30 copies of the selected book, subject specific audio/visual material, a folder of support materials and an information/contents sheet.







Storytime in a Bag



Each Storytime in a Bag kit includes 15 board book copies of a children's book, along with a copy for facilitators to read aloud, so each child has their own copy to hold and explore! Each kit comes with early literacy tips to get your group talking, singing, reading, writing, and playing -- the building blocks of early literacy that help get children ready to read! 






VOX[™] Books











Award Winners - Caldecott












Award Winners - Newbery










Award Winners - Coretta Scott King Book Awards



(Theodor Seuss) Geisel Award


The Geisel Award is given annually to the author(s) and illustrator(s) of the most distinguished A book for beginning readers published in English in the United States during the preceding year.




This award is for English-language children's and young adult books of exceptional merit relating to the gay, lesbian, bisexual and transgender experience.


American Indian Youth Literature Awards
