

#### Items of Note:

- Red Cross Blood Drive was a success with 29 appointments scheduled and 27 units collected. Our next drive is on August 13. We value our continued partnership with the American Red Cross.
- We hosted the Erie county Senior Services Book Club on May 29 and Coordinator of the program, Alisa Colatarci-Reiman, emailed me to thank our library for hosting. She complimented both the staff and facility.
- On May 30, local author Peter Talty presented on his book *Anatomy of a Pummeled Life*. The presentation was emotional and insightful and sometimes even humorous. We had 30 people in attendance.
- Dean Hunneshagen and his Joy of Trains visited the library on June 1 for an exciting "Jurassic Meets Modern World" train display (Dinosaurs and Nascar!). Fun time for all!
- The Clarence Library hosted the Clarence Central School District's strategic planning meeting on May 30 and the FSC Advisory Task Force group meeting on June 3.
- On June 6, Greg Kinal returned to the Clarence Library for a presentation commemorating the 80<sup>th</sup> anniversary of D-Day. Over 50 people attended this powerful presentation.
- HVAC update Tim Lavocat has a site meeting/visit scheduled with the engineers on Monday, 6/24 and from there the report will be finalized with recommendations for the replacement of the HVAC system.
- We have an excellent array of programs scheduled for the summer, including a new Summer Book Camp (Battle of the Books "plus"), Strategic Games for Teens, Lego Club. And this summer, one of Sarah's preschool programs is called "KinderSTEAM," a program which incorporates scientific principles and hands-on learning into story time.
- This year's Summer Reading theme is "Adventure Begins at Your Library." The Friends of the Library are running several fundraisers, including the Summer Basket Raffle, chicken barbeque and a Buffalo Sabres Jersey raffle. In addition, the Friends purchased two bikes and a wagon for our annual Bike/Wagon Raffle. They are also funding all of our summer programs and events, including Kidding Around Yoga, Nickel City Reptiles, Crochet and Crumpets, Nan Hoffman, and program supplies for Sarah's Makery Program. The Garden Friends of Clarence are purchasing the plants for two garden programs that are part of Sarah's Makery series—ZEN Garden and Teacup Garden.
- Outreach The Clarence Library will have a table at Fireworks in the Park on June 29 and at Summer Fest on July 20. Both events will be great opportunities for us to promote the Clarence Public Library.
- On June 6, Monica and Justin met with several members of Bank on Buffalo at the library to discuss our banking needs.
- Staff development All staff of the Clarence Public Library have completed their annual compliance training (sexual harassment, workplace violence and cyber-security training). On June 12, Monica attended the Manager-Director Meeting (virtual); also on June 12, Monica attended an in-person training at the Audubon Library *Workplace Violence*

Prevention/Conflict Resolution and De-Escalation when Dealing with Difficult People. This program was presented by WNYCOSH – Western New York Council on Occupational Health and Safety). One June 18, Monica attended the webinar - *Trustee Handbook Book Club: Sustainability as the Newest Core Value*. This program was presented by Rebekkah Smith Aldrich from the Mid-Hudson Library System. The information presented in the program was very informative and aligns with some of the long-term and short-term goals of the Clarence Public Library.
