
While many of us are familiar with Arthur Conan Doyle and his Sherlock Holmes stories, Anna Katharine Green is credited as being the "mother of the detective novel." Her first book, *The Leavenworth Case*, was published in 1878 (nine years before Doyle published the *A Study in Scarlet*, the first Sherlock Holmes story). Green's book was a huge hit and over the next 40 years she published 37 novels. Green moved to Buffalo with her family in 1888 and continued to write and publish. She died in Buffalo in 1935.


Sir Arthur Conan Doyle met Anna Katharine Green on a U.S. lecture tour in 1894 and many people believe that Doyle was inspired by Green's protagonists from *The Leavenworth Case*. Call 716-741-2650 to register.
