Hamburg Library

January's theme was Penguins with 454 participants. February's theme was Valentine's Day with 599 children participating.

Lake Shore Library

February's theme was Pete the Cat with 45 participants.

Art Show

The West Seneca Art Society held an art show during February. Members approached this writer last year because they love the space! The art show will run again in August. This is in addition to the Centennial Art Center running shows twice each year.

Dedication of Historical Photo Murals

On March 1 a ceremony was held to dedicate the historical photo murals installed in the meeting room at the Hamburg Library. The murals were funded by Imagine: Hamburg. Hamburg Library

Programs offered this month include:

LEGO Club

Senior Pages Lauren and Emily coordinated LEGO Club, which is held the 1st Saturday and 2nd Wednesday of each month. This is for children ages 6 to 11. Children use their imagination to make wonderful creations. Afterwards, they are displayed in the Children's area. Hamburg YES (Youth Engaged Services) volunteers assist with these programs. In February there were 63 participants and in March there were 56 participants.

Story Time

Librarian Nicole held Story Time, a lively event full of songs, movements and stories for children ages 0 to 5. Themes included: valentines, colors, and monsters. The program is held weekly on Wednesday mornings. There were 128 patrons attending in February.

Baby Bounce

In February and March, Librarian Nicole held lapsit story time for children ages 0 to 2. The program is held on the 2nd and 4th Monday of each month. In February there were 93 attendees. On March 10 there were 44 attendees. Each child receives their own book to hold during the program.

Button Day

Button day is held on the 1st and 3rd Thursdays of each month. Supplies are placed on a table for participants. After completing their design, participants come to the public service desk to get their button made.

Camp Create

Librarian Trainee Sarah hosted Camp Create, a crafting program for children ages 6 to 12, on January 27 and February 24 from 6pm to 7pm. For January the theme was Dog

Man, with 20 children and 9 adults in attendance. Children crafted Dog Man hats and badges in celebration of the Dog Man movie coming out. For February the theme was dinosaurs with 10 children and 8 adults in attendance. Children crafted paper dinosaurs and decorated them with feathers, buttons, sequins, googly eyes, and pom-poms.



Colorful Tuesday

On February 4 Librarian Trainee Sarah hosted Colorful Tuesday from 5pm to 7pm with 3 adults and 1 child in attendance, and on Tuesday, March 4 with 2 adults in attendance. Colorful Tuesday is a passive program that provides coloring books, coloring pages and coloring supplies for adults and children to enjoy while they are in the library.

Green Eggs and Ham

On February 21 Sundance Kids Farms presented a program on Green Eggs and Ham. Children got to meet live chickens that lay green eggs! They also learned about the life cycle of a chicken. There were 43 in attendance.

Pokémon Club

On March 11 Librarian Trainee Sarah started Pokémon Club, a new program for children ages 6 to 12, with 16 children and 5 adults in attendance. Children learned how to play the Pokémon Trading Card Game, which teaches them strategy, math, and improves reading comprehension. The program will run the 2nd Tuesday of every month from 4pm to 6pm. Two teens from the community volunteered to help the younger children learn the game, and will continue to volunteer for future club meetings. Children were also able to do Pokémon themed crafts, such as create your

own Poke ball. This program was made possible by the generous donation of Pokémon cards from several patrons.

Eight O'Clock Book Club

On February 6 the library hosted the Eight O'Clock Book Club with 8 participants in attendance both in-person and virtually. February's title was, *Strange Sally Diamond* by Liz Nugent. The club was created by a group of 15 women who have a passion for books! Meetings, called Strangers to Booklovers, aim to build a vibrant local community of readers and library lovers alike. Meetings are held quarterly with the group rotating to a different library. All are welcome to join! Librarian Nicole coordinated this event and assisted with advertising, which included making short videos for the social media.

One-on-one sessions were held on February 14 and March 14 with a technology trainer from the Central Library. Five and 6 patrons attended respectively.

On February 26 the library hosted the sibling violin trio Vibrant Strings with 56 attendees. Everyone commented on how wonderful the music was! Afterwards, the Hamburg Coalition for Equity and Inclusion hosted a reception for the event providing cookies and fruit.

Walk to Remember by Nicholas Sparks with 11 in attendance. Discussions are always lively and stimulating.

Book Displays

In celebration of Black History Month, an African American History display was created with books, movies, and informational materials supporting African American History highlighting programming at the B&ECPL.

In celebration of Women's History Month, Librarian Jordan created a display in the teen area focusing on women authors and achievements. Librarian Trainee Sarah also created a display in the children's area with the same theme.

Librarian Trainee Sarah created book displays for February and March. For February the displays were "Mystery Date with a Book," featuring books wrapped up as presents and "Psychological Thrillers: for those not interested in romance." The March display was "Library Staff Picks: We hope some of our favorite books will be yours too!" Featuring a selection of books chosen by the library staff.
