1. PUBLIC SERVICES

Programs, Learning Opportunities, Outreach and Events

Highlights:

- September 4 SCORE (The Service Corp of Retired Executives) presented a morning workshop on Starting and Running Your Business at the Julia Boyer Reinstein Library. Twenty-two potential entrepreneurs learned the basics of starting a business and met mentors who could provide guidence. Director Dan Caufield spoke to the attendees about the free resources the Library offers and signed up anyone who did not already have a Library card.
- September 18 & 30 The Western New York Lace Guild offered free Bobbin Lace Classes at both the Julia Boyer Reinstein Library (Sept. 18) and Anna M.

- September 25 The Anna Reinstein Memorial Library, partnering with the Erie County Department of Health, sponsored a NARCAN training workshop. The opioid epidemic is still lingering in Erie County and the use of NARCAN saves lives. Zachary Kay from the Department of Health provided an overview on the County's activities stemming the opioid crisis and showed how NARCAN can resuscitate an individual who may have suffered an overdose. The meeting was well received with attendees able to leave informed, prepared and empowered to render aid in cases of opioid overdose. Libraries have been said to give second chances and there is no greater second chance than to save a life.
- September 24 Anna Reinstein Memorial Library hosted a health and wellness
 program in partnership Just Say Yes. Just Say Yes (JSY) is a NYS initiative
 dedicated to empowering adults and families to make informed food choices.
 During the workshop, Angie Braun, a nutritionist from Just Say Yes, reviewed
 techniques to incorporate more fruits and vegetables into cooking. She
 demonstrated a recipe for participants with samples for tasting. All the recipes
 Ms. Braun presents are low in cost and have SNAP recipients in mind.



• September 28 - Anna Reinstein Memorial Library hosted a free Pumpkin Patch Family Fun program. The program included scarecrow crafts, petting zoo animals, games, a magic show, and real pumpkins for all the children that attended. The programs activities were provided in coordination with Creative Learning Productions.



• Throughout September, the Julia Boyer Reinstein Library coordinated "Hooks, Needles and Thread" a knitting workshop and get together where members enjoy each other's company while sharing knitting tips and displaying projects. Due to the popularity and changing schedules of a few attendees an additional afternoon was added to Tuesdays at 5pm. Twisted Stitches and Beginner and Intermediate Knitting hours at both Libraries continue with the help of local knitting volunteer Judy Wipej.



 Continuing the partnership with Cheektowaga Y.E.S (Youth Engaged in Service), both Cheektowaga Libraries hosted Lego Clubs and Craft Nights for children under 12 years old coordinated by area teens volunteers. Both these programs are very well liked by attendees and they provide community service hours required for the teens' graduations, and are an excellent opportunity for them to make new friends and gain leadership experience.





Outreach:

• September 13 - Director Caufield met with Buffalo and Cheektowaga students at Erie Community College with other Astronomers, Storytellers and STEM Teachers to explore our solar system and prepare the students for NASA's Observe the Moon Day. Observe the Moon Day, held September 14, is a yearly event promoted by NASA to instill interest in the moon and astronomy in general.



• September 17 - Director Caufield spoke at "Arts and Entrepreneurs", a Small Business Development Center (SBDC) event held at Buffalo State University. Caufield's presentation featured free library resources entrepreneurs can use to build a business plan and conduct market research. Many attendees were happy to learn about these resources and those without Library cards were able to sign up that night to explore how the Library can help grow their businesses.


 Both Cheektowaga Libraries are updating Large Print collections thanks to a generous donation from Christine Cywinski


